Greater Dallas Planning Council Wins 2017 CLIDE Award

Hurst, Texas, June 16, 2017 — Fernando Costa, Assistant City Manager of Fort Worth, presented the Greater Dallas Planning Council with a 2017 CLIDE Award at the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) General Assembly. A nationally recognized jury of experts in the fields of architecture, urban planning, and development chose the distinguished awardees of the Celebrating Leadership in Development Excellence (CLIDE) Award. The Projects chosen by the jurors are identified as ones that greatly demonstrate one or more of the Principles of Development Excellence: Development Diversity, Pedestrian Design, Housing Choice, Activity Centers, Environmental Stewardship, Quality Places, Efficient Mobility Options, Resource Efficiency, Educational Opportunity, Healthy Communities, and Implementation. The Center of Development Excellence recommends these principles as a guide to cities, counties, school districts, other public agencies, and the private sector as they plan and create future development and redevelopment in the region.

The CLIDE award program was created in 2003 to encourage innovative development projects and practices that will help accommodate for an explosive growth. North Central Texas is predicted to add around 4.1 million new residents by the year 2040, growing to over 10.8 million people. Innovative projects will help to ensure a sustainable growth for generations to come.

The award ceremony was held at the Hurst Conference Center. This annual meeting brings together local elected officials, government professionals from across the region, legislators representing North Central Texas, NCTCOG's past presidents, board members, and committee members; state and federal agency representatives; and other special guests.
