INSTRUCTIONS FOR NOMINATIONS - GENERAL SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Information submitted should specifically demonstrate the project, individual or team's achievements that meet the purpose and criteria of the specific award. The Jury will **only** consider materials submitted as part of a nomination package, so be sure to provide enough information to fully describe the project, as well as explain and articulate the merits of the project in your submission.
2. **Please complete this form and one of the following, Form A, Form B or Form C, that best apply to your nomination:**
 - Project Overview or Summary, or Name of Person being nominated (self-nominations are accepted)
 - Team members – owner, prime and other consultants, others as appropriate
 - Why the nominee or project is meritorious
 - Other information as appropriate
3. Information must be submitted in electronic file formats, multiple emails (each 10MB or less) are acceptable:
 - This page completed and one of the completed two '**2023 Nomination Form**' (**Word** or **PDF** accepted)
 - Maximum of 12 high-resolution digital images (jpg.) Maximum 1.5MB each
 - Required especially for **Built Award & Dream/Study Award** categories with Form A
 - CV for the nominee is required for individual nominations in **Kessler Award, Dunnigan Community Outreach Award, or Mark Goode Urban Pioneer Award** categories with Form B
 - Images and written information files should be named with the project name with image number i.e.: **GDPC Plaza 1.doc, GDPC Plaza 2.jpg**, etc.
4. Nominations must have owner's permission for submittal.

Built Project Award

- Does the project contribute to the public realm while also enhancing the transition from public to private or private to public space?
- Does the project create a successful private or public space?

Dream/Study Award

- Does the proposed project exemplify best practices in urban design?
- Does the proposed project employ innovative strategies to improve the quality of place, artistic value, and/or quality of life in the community?
- If built or implemented, would the proposed project embody the criteria for the Built Awards?
- Would the proposed project be an asset to the community?

- Does this nominee (individual or group) promote and advocate for new and innovative ideas and changes in the urban environment and/or community advocacy?
- Does this nominee (individual or group) exhibit extraordinary initiative and impact within a recent timeframe – “up and coming”?
